The Institute of Childhood and Education (ICE) continues to grow and attract a diverse range of students and we are currently in an exciting phase of developing new programmes to meet local, regional and national demand and interest.

Our Education provision currently includes undergraduate, postgraduate, university and school-led programmes in primary and secondary education. The Children, Young People and Families portfolio includes foundation and professional practice top up programmes at Levels 4-6, alongside undergraduate and postgraduate provision. Additionally, within the ICE team, we also deliver an increasingly broad range of other programmes, including the National Award for Special Educational Needs Co-ordination (NASENCo) Postgraduate Certification at Level 7, a foundation year programme, the Higher Level Teaching Assistant award, Higher Level Apprenticeship Degrees (at Levels 4 and 5) and CPD programmes for newly qualified and experienced professionals. This post will focus on Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) and the successful candidate will need to have knowledge of SEND legislation and provision and be able to deliver the NASENCo award. Additionally, in order to further develop our growing portfolio, the postholder will also need an appropriate academic background to enable a contribution to modules at postgraduate level, for example, relating to Mental Health in Children and Young People, Safeguarding and Child Protection and Leadership and Management of Integrated Services.

Applicants will need to be experienced and successful practitioners, able to demonstrate knowledge, skills and/or experience of delivering teaching and learning across a range of delivery methods, ideally including work-based learning and distance learning. The successful candidate will need to be able to work flexibly and collegiately in supporting programmes to a diverse range of learners throughout the year, with some evening and weekend work.

We are keen to ensure that team members are able to contribute relevant areas of research and knowledge exchange and have innovative and creative ideas to inform future planning and

development. We are therefore looking for solution-focused individuals who can think creatively and imaginatively and have the ability to adapt to changing circumstances and new ideas.
