We are looking to appoint an enthusiastic, collaborative, high performing member of staff to contribute to our programmes in Criminology and Police Studies. We have also recently secured a contract to work with West Yorkshire Police to deliver the Police Constable Degree Apprenticeship from 2020.

This post will contribute to our undergraduate programmes in Criminology, Sociology, and Police Studies and the new apprenticeship programme. The ability to teach core areas of study in Criminology and Police Studies as relevant to the post and across all levels is essential for both forms of contract. Candidates should ideally have: experience of teaching and/or professional practice in policing in rural and metropolitan areas, police leadership development and delivery, understanding diversity and difference in a policing context, experience in developing innovative impactful modules and programmes, an understanding of national policing models and organisations linked to the political environment, and experience applying criminology to enhance evidence-based policing. The ability to contribute to either Qualitative or Quantitative Research Methods at undergraduate and postgraduate level is also desirable. The ideal candidates will also bring links and external contacts to help facilitate the development of our research and knowledge exchange portfolios and will demonstrate potential for income generation for research and/or knowledge exchange.

We welcome applications from candidates who have a PhD in Criminology and/or Policing, or a closely related area of study (Lecturer), or the equivalent in professional expertise and experience (University Teacher). Applicants for a Lecturer contract should be research active with a track record of publications commensurate with their career stage. The ability to work as an effective team member, contributing to the provision of high-quality teaching across undergraduate and postgraduate levels, is essential for both forms of contract.

This post will provide an ideal opportunity for a new member of staff to support the further development of Criminology, Sociology and Police Studies, knowledge exchange (University Teacher), and research activity and postgraduate studies (Lecturer) with us at Leeds Trinity University.
